They recently moved to Manchester, NH with Buddy, Jeremy's service dog, where they enjoy competitive game nights and quiet weekend mornings (when it's not football season). Although maintaining school life, family life, and football life can be difficult, Jeremy has continued to succeed in all three aspects. After being patched in 2016 by the NHFOA, he has continued to put the interest of the association first and helped work with new members to help everyone succeed. Learning from the many great officials in this association, Jeremy has been fortunate to officiate multiple playoff games including two division four semi-finals. Jeremy has demonstrated himself on and off the field with professionalism and dedication to the game of football and the safety of the high school and youth football players in NH.
